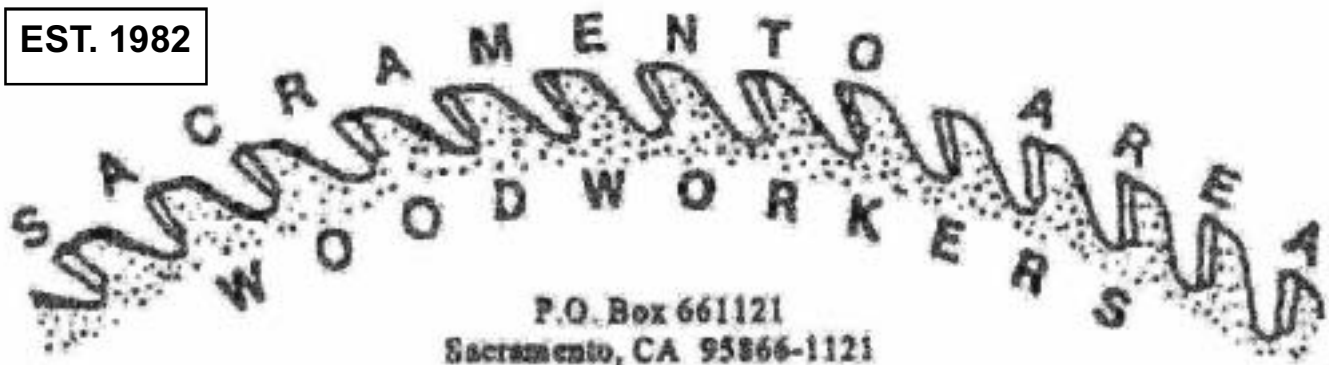


We will still have our regular show and tell, so bring your latest projects for display. I know that the toys will probably take center stage, but we all still like seeing the other projects as well.

The first order was to assemble the face frame. Then the cabinet was assembled using only screws and no glue (it is going to be a shop cabinet!), with the able help of Jason Beam. In less than an hour and a half, the two had an assembled cabinet, minus the drawers and top. It was solid as a rock and very neat! Thanks to Alan and Nancy for hosting us.

The marquetry was set up in the "pad method" with 6 different veneers & 3 different veneers. This is for a coaster set. The members cut out the patterns and then the pieces were glued on paper. to make a picture with different types of wood veneer. Bob Schieck then demonstrated his method of re-sawing on the bandsaw wiith no fence! Next he planed the cherry wood to 3/8" thickness. Bob Schieck also showed the members his gluing fixture for edge gluing thin pieces of wood together. All the parts for "Santa's Workshop Clock" were turned in. Bob will start the assembly. Buzz Arnould demonstrated his machine for make large stickers. Thank you Bob Schieck.

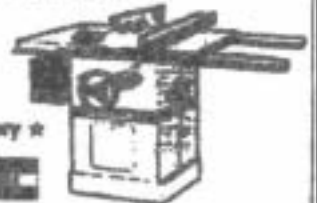

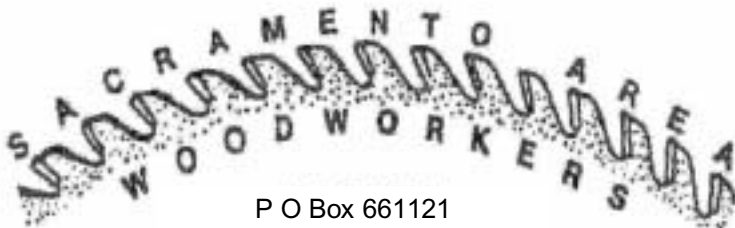
