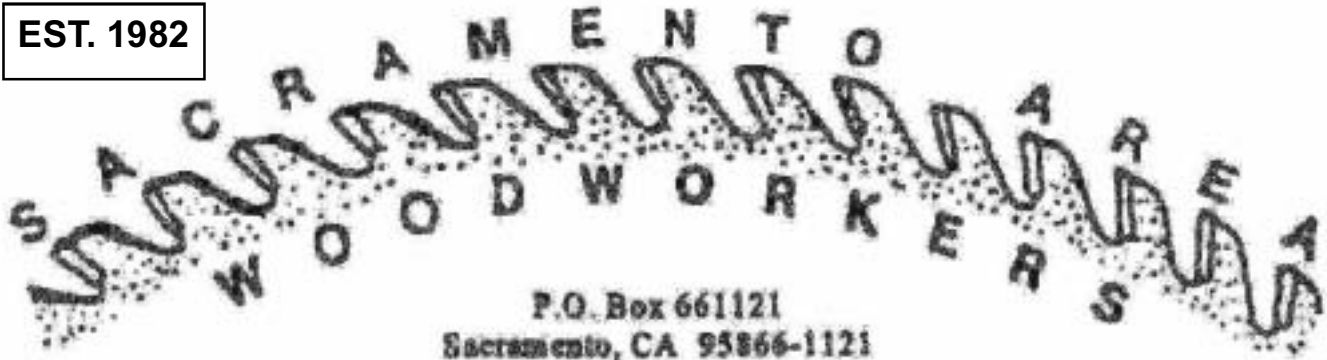

President's Notes:

Have you ever heard the expression "Water, water everywhere, but not a drop to drink?" For some woodworkers in our club, the saying could be "Wood, wood everywhere, but not the wood I want."

The guest speakers for our February 7th club meeting will present some very valuable and helpful information on obtaining and selecting wood--including wood harvested from urban forests (trees growing in and around the Sacramento area).

Instead of resigning yourself to the oak, pine, and other "standard" woods you pick up at your local lumber supplier, come to our February general club meeting. Find out how you can obtain some truly beautiful wood stock locally--even "exotic" lumber species--without having to go broke or buy a boatload. And learn how you can get the fine-figured and beautifully-grained wood you seek--wood that otherwise might have just ended up as firewood, or worse yet, ended up in the local landfill. It will be an interesting club meeting February 7th that we can learn from our invited guest presenters.

The February 7th club meeting will also be our annual birdhouse competition. The rules are pretty basic: Bring a birdhouse you built to the February meeting! (Sorry, but birdhouses must

not have been entered in SAW competitions previously.) Prizes will be awarded to the first, second, and third-place birdhouse winners. It will be a fun way to see club-member creativity, and examine some really crafty bird-living quarters!

If you have not done so yet, put some time in your schedule this month to attend a SAW Special Interest Group ("SIG") club meeting. SAW SIGs are great ways to learn from others--and share your woodworking skills too.

We have a lot of great SAW events coming up in the coming months--from our spring "Shop Tour" (which includes invitations at this time for SAW members willing to open their workshops for fellow members to visit)--to our club's semiannual "Tool Swap" event--to be held May 6th at the Sacramento WoodCraft store. We are trying to make the club "your club"--a club you can depend upon to be useful to your woodworking interests.

Getting together with other woodworkers is a fun way to enjoy our hobby. And for the \$30.00 annual membership in SAW, our club is one of the best bargains in town. 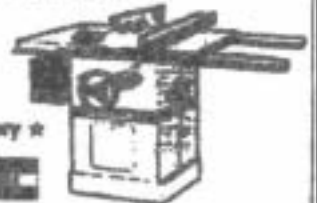

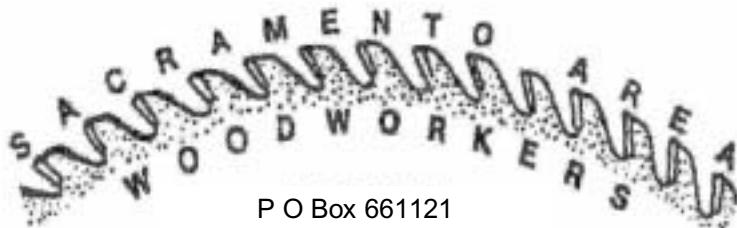
